Association of Manitoba Land Surveyors Appoints First-Ever Woman President

[Winnipeg, MB - November 6th, 2025] The Association of Manitoba Land Surveyors (AMLS) is proud to announce the appointment of Tricia Christie as its new President — marking a historic milestone as the first woman to hold the position in the organization’s 145-year history.

A trailblazer in her field, Christie is a Deputy Examiner of Surveys at Teranet Manitoba, and previously served as Vice-President of the AMLS and as a member of its Executive Council. She also holds the distinction of being the first woman land surveyor in the Province of Manitoba. Christie began working in the land surveying field in 2007 and received her commission as a Canada Land Surveyor in 2010 and as a Manitoba Land Surveyor in 2012.

“It’s an incredible honour to serve as President of an organization that has been such an important part of my professional journey,” said Christie. “The surveying profession is built on precision, collaboration, and integrity — values I will continue to uphold as we guide the next generation of surveyors and strengthen our role in Manitoba’s growth and development.”

Christie graduated from the University of Calgary with a Bachelor of Science in Geomatics Engineering and has been a strong advocate for mentorship, professional education, and inclusion in the surveying industry. She brings a wealth of technical expertise and a deep commitment to public service, shaped by her experience in both private practice and her current role at Teranet Manitoba.

“The election of Tricia Christie as our first woman President is a proud and significant moment for AMLS,” said Derek Arthur, outgoing President. “Her leadership and vision will continue to move our profession forward, inspiring future generations of surveyors.”

Established in 1881, the AMLS is the oldest land surveying association in Canada. It is a professional, self-governing body operating under *The Land Surveyors Act (Manitoba)*, which regulates the practice of land surveying for the protection of the public and administration of the profession.
